

Wilcox Female Institute Update



Wilcox Female Institute Cupola to receive much needed repair.

The cupola on the roof of the Female Institute is in dire need of repair. There are compromised corners and the railing is most likely the one that was installed in the 1970's when the Institute was restored. A

large crane with bucket will need to be rented in order to gain access to the area. Joe Harris has agreed to do the work now that the soil is dried out enough to get the crane on the property without disrupting the grounds. Work on the cupola should begin late summer.
