# **Blake and Bettie Field Receive Historic Preservation Award**

Blake and Bettie Field received the prestigious statewide Award for Historic Preservation from the Alabama Trust at the annual meeting in Huntsville on September 21. They were nominated for their ongoing restoration and preservation efforts of the homes located on Broad Street in Camden. Garland Smith accepted the award on behalf of the family.

#### **Roberts Cabin Project**

The Town of Pine Apple agreed to accept the cabin, and it has been relocated to the Pine Apple town park. The Wilcox Historical Society assisted in coordinating the project, with the formal contract between the Roberts family and the Town of Pine Apple. Funding for the project was provided by the Roberts Family, the Town of Pine Apple, and the Wilcox Historical Society. The Society made a \$2,000 donation to the project in honor of Don and Mary Charles Donald. Harold Grimes donated the new lumber required for the flooring, roof joists, and end siding. Joe Harris performed the move and erection at the new site. The remaining work as

of this date is the erection of the chimney by Michael Phelps using the original limestone rocks and "chinking" between the logs. A historical plaque will be placed at the site denoting the history of the cabin. Pine Apple Promotions will help with the funding for this final phase of the project, but private donations are also needed. When in Pine Apple, be sure to go by and visit this cabin. It will be featured at the annual Hunter Appreciation Day on November 28, 2007. 


